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2015-2016

Department of **Biotechnology:** Chiasma Science Exhibition

Department of Biotechnology: Chiasma Science Exhibition

Chiasma 2016 was a two day exhibition cum event hosted by the Department of Biotechnology, Dhempe College of Arts and Science, on 6th & 7th December 2016. It was an endeavour to promote scientific inquisitiveness among budding young students. The exhibition was visited by young enthusiastic students from different Higher Secondary Schools and Colleges from Goa. These included Higher Secondary Schools such as M.E.S Higher Secondary School, Vasantrao Dempo Higher Secondary School of Arts & Science - Miramar, S.S. Samiti Higher secondary school of science – Ponda and high school like Sharda Mandir School - Miramar. Various projects, posters and models on Biotechnology and different instruments used in Biotechnology-related experiments were showcased.

A training session was organized by the Department of Economics under 'Women Entrepreneurship' for women of Penha De Franca village on May 17, 2017. Around 35 women participated in this programme. The 02 faculty members and 05 students of the college were involved in the training session.



Department of Philosophy

Survey on 'ecological crises in and around Panaji'.15 students of Philosophy Department had organized an ecological survey where the teacher Miss Sendra Pereira along with the students actively participated in witnessing the polluted areas and questioning the local residents on the problems faced by them due to the environmental problems.

The **Ecological Survey** was on 19 February 2017 in areas like Chimbel, Merces, Santa Cruz and other local and public places of Panaji like ktc bus stand, Panaji market etc.

Many issues were brought forward and thus the environmental depletion was noted and will be shown in this report. KTC bus stand was the first place visited ; the area was crowded along with garbage gathered in every single corner of the area.

In spite of the dust bins available around still people misused the public area and garbage was seen around everywhere.

Sulabh was also there on the bus stand but the conductors as well as the educated people were seen urinating in the corners and thus made the area stinky and unbearable.





Street Play on Garbage Issues

23rd February 2017 Department of Philosophy organized a **street play Awareness programme on garbage issues** in Goa. 18 Philosophy students with the teacher Ms Sendra Pereira organized a street play creating awareness in nearby areas affected by garbage issues. This awareness programme was held specially as a social responsibility after realizing and studying the ecological issues in this particular areas. Locals of this area were made realize that its individuals duty to keep their surroundings clean and protect the environment as in long and short run going to affect their health. Through the street play the students created awareness about various health problems caused by this garbage issues. The street play was performance also focused on the fact that it should be collective work of locals to come together n detail with this problems. The street play was performed at major garbage affected areas around Panaji that is Panaji ktc bus stand, and Panjim market ,Chimbel, Merces, etc. The awareness programme was organized as a social responsibility of students to society and environment.



Outreach activity: Sky-watching programme

The faculty members of Dhempe College of Arts and Science in collaboration with Association of Friends of Astronomy (AFA) conducted a sky-watching programme for the people of Penha de Franca. Around 20 to 30 people from this village, especially youngsters, attended this programme and enjoyed the view of the night sky with telescopes. Four faculty members were involved in this outreach activity of the College which was held on April 17, 2017.



2017-18

Department of English

The Department of English, Dhempe College of Arts and Science, established an internship program with National Association for the Blind, St. Cruz, Goa. A group of 20 students visited the centre for five consecutive Sundays in February and March 2018. The interns organised various activities for the NAB students including singing competitions, sports related activities and dance sessions. They also interacted on a one-to-one basis with the students. Tara Saldanha was the internship coordinator for the program.





The aim of this internship is to establish a social consciousness and inculcate in the interns a concern and respect for the differently abled. Each intern was required to maintain a work log of each visit which was submitted at the end of the program. To successfully complete the internship, each intern was required to complete a minimum of 4 hours.

The program was met with an enthusiastic response from the college students who took up planning and organising activities for each visit under the guidance of the faculty in charge. The administration at NAB, Goa also expressed their gratitude and praise for this initiative which is working to encourage inclusive education and social concern.

Department Of Economics

The Department of Economics organized an extension activity on Financial literacy among rural women. The extension service was conducted by incorporating the students of FYBA DSC Economics. The objective of having such an extension service was to share basic financial knowledge among the women of rural villages who somehow are often excluded from the financial perspective. The extension service would make them more aware and independent.

The students had to select at least 5 women from their neighborhood and make them financially literate. The service was provided first in a village named Kamrabad in Tonca by Hridya Sudarshan and Manaswini Chavariya. The aim of the extension service was first to find out how many women in that village did not have a bank account and thereby informing them about the importance of having one. The students spoke to 10 women from that village from which 5 did not have any bank accounts. The students later educated the women on the importance and advantages of having a bank account and how one should or can operate it.

The second extension service was conducted in Chorao village by Yogini. She spoke to 5 women from her neighborhood and informed them about the schemes that banks provide and how they can be benefited from the same. Yogini also made the women aware about the key highlights of the Union budget 2018 by focusing on which consumer goods henceforth will be more expensive and which one will be cheaper.





Department Of Philosophy

• Street play on 'ill effects of plastic- free India from plastic' was performed at College and in and around the city of Panjim.

On the occasion of Goa liberation day 19th December 2017 Ms Sendra Pereira Philosophy Department organized awareness program. The awareness was created by students by performing a street play in and around Panjim. The students performed at various places in the Capital, Panjim. Beginning at Panjim Church Immaculate Conception, then Panjim Bus stand and lastly Donapaula. • Visit to Shanti Avedhana Sadan (palliative care for cancer patients).

On 23rd December 2017 Ms Sendra Pereira organized a trip for the Philosophy Department students to Shanti Avedhana Sadan (palliative care for cancer patients)lotolim. This visit was organized as the part of extension service of the department. A group of 20 students visited this place.

A Small entertainment program was presented and preformed enthusiastically by our students for patients and staff of the institution which included singing old Konkani songs, dance, comedy acts and Christmas carols. The programme was held in one of the ward of the institution as there was few terminally ill patients. After the programme students interacted with the patients and expressed their care and love towards them.

The students also interacted with the staff of the institution doing such selfless service. The sister in charge palliative care explained to students that palliative care focuses on preventing, managing, and relieving the symptoms of cancer and any side effects caused by treatment. It also provides comprehensive support to people living with cancer and their families. Any person,

regardless of age or type and stage of cancer, may receive palliative care before, during, and after treatment.

The students were touched by looking at the care taken by the staff and they learnt to respect their own self and to spread happiness whenever possible. The administration at Shanti Avedhana Sadan ,expressed their gratitude and praised for this initiative taken by department which is working to encourage inclusive education and social concern.



Department of Psychology

1. As a part of the Jagruti initiative,(an Extension programme in collaboration with Sangath Goa, to spread Mental Health awareness) students participated in two mental health awareness programmes, one at NOMOZO on 10th December 2017 at Porvorim and the other at Our Lady of Merces School on 10th February 2018. DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The Department of Psychology has initiated two extension programmes, the details of which are as follows:

1. **WANGDA programme** – This is a student volunteer initiative for the S.Y.B.A. students of the department. Through this programme, students volunteer at Disha School for special children thus gaining exposure and experience in the field. The following activities were conducted as a part of the programme.

a. A visit to Disha School was organized by Dr. Wendy Manuel and Dr. Joslyn Henriques for the SYBA Students of Psychology on 24th July 2018. 30 students along with 2 teachers visited the school. The purpose of this visit was to sensitize students regarding diversity and inclusion.



b. An Exhibition cum sale of products made by students of Disha School was organized in the college campus on 8th and 9th August 2018 which was facilitated by Dr. Wendy Manuel. 11 TYBA Psychology students assisted in the exhibition cum sale. 2. JAGRUTI Programme – This programme is a mental health awareness initiative for various villages in Goa conducted in collaboration with Sangath, Porvorim – Goa. The importance of creating awareness holds the key to treatment and effective outcomes and thus, keeping this in mind, the students of FYBA, SYBA, and TYBA performed a street play creating awareness about mental health. The street play showcased an array of everyday situations using humour and drama to bring to light various mental health disorders, social stigma, and myths associated with mental health. The play also highlighted how compassionate and emphatic care along with expert advice and medication can heal anyone with mental health issues. The street plays were conducted on 27th September 2018 at Merces Village Panchayat and on 28th September 2018 at Merces Church ground and the same were coordinated by Dr. MuktaKaramadi, Dr. Joslyn Henriques, and Ms. PranitaKalangutkar (Counsellor).20 students participated in the street play.

1. Beach Cleaning Drive at Miramar:

On the occasion of green day 3rd August 2018 the enthusiastic staff and students of the Department of Philosophy actively participated in the beach cleaning drive. This drive was initiated by Ms. Sendra Pereira and Ms. Maria Fabiola Barreto. 1) Workshop for students of colleges in Goa on "Citation, Referencing and Bibliography as per MLA 8th Edition"

The Department of English, in collaboration with Research Cell, Dhempe College of Arts and Science, conducted a One-Day State Level Workshop on "Citation, Referencing and Bibliography as per MLA 8th Edition" on August 22, 2019, in the Seminar Hall of the college. The workshop was organized in a view of acquainting the students of languages with the skill of conducting research and usage of MLA 8th Edition stylesheet in in-text citation and bibliography in the project reports. A total of nine colleges from all over Goa were represented by 32 students for this workshop. All the TYBA English students (General and Honours, 35) of Dhempe College also participated in this workshop.

The workshop was inaugurated by Principal, Dr. Vrinda Borker. She welcomed the gathering and stressed on the need to conduct research in a systematic manner. Ms. Clarinda Dias, Incharge, Department of English, addressed the gathering and introduced the theme of the workshop. She also informed the students about the resource persons whose expertise they were going to get benefitted from in the course of the day. Dr. Wendy Manual, Convenor, Research Cell was also present on the dais on this occasion.

The following is the itinerary of the workshop:

10.00 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. SESSION ONE The Purpose of Research, Formulating Hypothesis, Research Methodology – Designing Aim and Objectives, Conducting Literature Survey, Delineating Limitations, Resourcing Information from different mediums.

- 11.15 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. SESSION TWO Avoiding Plagiarism towards Ethical Research
- 12.15 p.m. to 1.00 p.m. SESSION THREE Intellectual Property Rights Relevance and Rubrics
- 2.00 p.m. to 3.00 p.m. SESSION FOUR Word Repositories, Referencing and In-Text Citations
- 3.15 p.m. to 4.15 p.m. SESSION FIVE Writing Bibliography

Session One: This session titled "The Purpose of Research, Formulating Hypothesis, Research Methodology – Designing Aim and Objectives, Conducting Literature Survey, Delineating

Limitations, Resourcing Information from different mediums" aimed at acquainting the students with basic structure of conducting research at the TYBA level. Ms. Akshata Bhatt, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Dhempe College was the resource person for the session. Through Mentimeter, she obtained the students' responses on what research is, and elaborated on the same in her session. She discussed various aspects of a project report such as literature survey, primary texts, chapter schemata etc.

Session Two: This session was titled "Avoiding Plagiarism towards Ethical Research" and was conducted by Ms. Nafisa Oliveira, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Goa University. A post-graduate in law, Ms. Oliveira introduced the concept of plagiarism to the participants and informed them on how to acknowledge sources of information in order to avoid plagiarism. She illustrated how subtle and unintentional plagiarism can get, and that one should be on guard while using seemingly harmless stock phrases.

Session Three: This session titled "Intellectual Property Rights – Relevance and Rubrics" was conducted by Dr. Amol Jadhav, Assistant Professor at Department of Chemistry, Post-Graduate Programme in Analytical Chemistry, Dhempe College of Arts and Science. Dr. Jadhav dealt extensively in his session with patenting and intellectual property rights, a field that has gained significance over the years in academics.

Session Four: Ms. Akshata Bhatt conducted the fourth session of the workshop on "Word Repositories, Referencing and In-Text Citations". Her presentation focussed on the style of writing research articles and reports; the words to be used to agree, disagree, refute or reinforce a point with references, and how to acknowledge these references according to their placement in research writing according to MLA 8th Edition Stylesheet.

Session Five: This session was an extension to the previous session, titled, "Writing Bibliography". Ms. Palia Pandit, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Dhempe College conducted this session. As the session was hands-on, students were divided into groups and were asked to identify five different sources they could use for their research, and were asked to write bibliographic entries for them, after referring to the illustrations. They were given links to a Padlet wherein they could write their entries, even after the workshop.

The valedictory session commenced at 4.30 p.m., and Ms. Manjiri Barve, Vice Principal of the college, graced this occasion with her presence. After the vote of thanks by Ms. Clarinda Dias, certificates were distributed to the participants. This followed by a group photograph of the participants and this marked the end of the workshop.


